USE OF VILLAGE OF SAUKVILLE PARKS

The Village of Saukville park system is comprised of eight parks with nearly 80 acres of recreational area. It is our mission to provide quality recreation programs and special events for our residents and neighbors to enjoy throughout the year.

All park facilities are available to local residents and their guests. Reservations must be made for private use of the Grady Park, Quade Park, or Schowalter Park pavilions and/or concession buildings, and also Veterans Park Bandstand by calling the Municipal Center between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. weekdays. Reservation forms can be found online at www.village.saukville.wi.us/communityinfo/parks. There is a fee plus a security deposit for reserving parks/pavilions and/or concession buildings. Resident and Non-resident fees apply. There is no fee for reserving Village ball fields. Please note: Reserving a pavilion/facility does not automatically reserve the ball field. Village teams have priority over private ball field use.

The tennis courts at Grady Park and Quade Park are available on a "first come-first serve" basis. The Grady Park courts are lit until 11:00 p.m. daily. The switch on the southwest light activates the lights for a 30 minute period. The Village Park System is available for all to use and enjoy. Please keep the parks clean and safe for everyone's benefit and enjoyment!

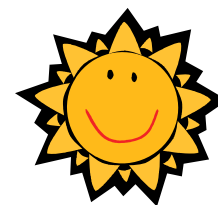

SAUKVILLE SUMMER PLAYGROUND PROGRAM



The Village of Saukville offers a Summer Playground Program that includes creative and energetic leaders, active games, theme craft sessions, and fun field trips. A trip to the Port Washington outdoor pool is offered once a week (weather permitting). Children are required to pay their own pool admission, either by pass or by daily fee. A minimal bus transportation fee will be charged. Our goal is to offer a safe and worry-free experience for both the child and parent. This is not a day-care program, but rather an afternoon alternative of outdoor fun and structured activities for kids ages 6 through 14. Notice to Participants:

- The Village of Saukville Recreation and Playground Programs are committed to providing safe activities and qualified instructors. Please recognize however, that activities described in this brochure may involve some risk. It is our policy, in the event of serious injury or illness, to contact the Saukville EMT/Fire Dept. and if necessary, to transport the participant to the nearest hospital or medical center.
- The Village of Saukville has the discretion to cancel the day's activities due to inclement weather or threat of inclement weather. Parents should have alternate arrangements in place in the event of emergency closing. When parents are not readily available, children must know their alternate location if the parks are closed.
- Refund Policy
Refunds will only be made under the following circumstances:
 - 1) Request is made a minimum of 7 days prior to the start of the summer session.
 - 2) If a participant becomes ill and a doctor's statement is provided (refund will be prorated).
 - 3) When the program is cancelled due to lack of enrollment (refund will be prorated).
 - 4) A \$5.00 processing fee will be charged for each requested refund.

The Youth Baseball Leagues feature teams within the Village of Saukville, and provide a fun-filled season for all children and parents. Each team member is allowed to play at some point in every game. "Early-bird" registration will run through **March 31**. We will accept registrations after March 31st, but they will be subject to an additional \$10 late fee.

Recreation League Tee-Ball:

The Recreation Tee-Ball League is generally for 4 and 5 year olds, and provides an introduction to the basic fundamentals of baseball, primarily tee-ball hitting and fielding skills. Players are given a team shirt and cap. Practices and games are normally on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at Quade Park. Early-bird registration fees are \$40 for Saukville residents and \$55 for non-residents. Call Nikki Mathews at (262) 268-1019, or e-mail wimathews@yahoo.com for more info.

Recreation League Coach-Pitch:

The Recreation Coach-Pitch League is generally for 6 and 7 year olds, and continues to develop the basic fundamentals that were introduced in Tee-Ball. Batters hit against pitches thrown by the coaches or a pitching machine. Modified baseball rules are used to prepare players for the transition to the Recreation League Majors. Players are given a team shirt and cap. Practices and games are primarily on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at Quade Park. Early-bird registration fees are \$40 for Saukville residents and \$55 for non-residents. Call Nikki Mathews at (262) 268-1019, or e-mail wimathews@yahoo.com for more info.

Recreation League Majors:

The Recreation Majors League is for players ages 8-10, and features live player pitching, along with most other regular baseball rules. Skill levels and competition continue to increase to prepare players for the transition to the Traveling teams. Players are given a team shirt and cap. Practices and games are primarily on Monday and Wednesday evenings at Quade Park. Early-bird registration fees are \$50 for Saukville residents and \$65 for non-residents. The Saukville traveling baseball teams compete against teams from nearby communities. The games are quite competitive, and playing time is based on a player's attitude, willingness to practice, and skill level. "Early-bird" registration will run through **March 31**. We will accept registrations after March 31st, but they will be subject to an additional \$10 late fee.

Traveling Little League:

The Traveling Little League team is primarily for players ages 11 and 12 years old. Players cannot turn 13 prior to August 1st of the calendar year. These games are more competitive than those in the Recreation Leagues, and feature live pitching and base stealing, along with most regular baseball rules. Practices and home games will be held at Dickmann Field at Grady Park. Early-bird registration fees are \$60 for Saukville residents and \$75 for non-residents. Traveling Pony League:

The Traveling Pony League team is primarily for players completing 7th / 8th grades. These games feature live pitching, balks, lead-offs and base stealing, along with most regular baseball rules. Practices and home games will be held at Dickmann Field at Grady Park. Early-bird registration fees are \$60 for Saukville residents and \$75 for non-residents. REBELS FOOTBALL—2011

Rebels Football is for kids in grades 5 through 8 interested in playing tackle football. Participants must live in the Port Washington/Saukville School District. The Rebels are a charter member of the 52 team "Wisconsin All American Youth Football League" (AAYFL) playing in the Northeast Division. Games are played on Saturdays - home games at Rebel (Didier) Field in West Riverside Park on So. Main St. Practices are held at Schowalter Park north on Hwy W to Schowalter Dr. Fundamentals and safety are the primary objectives of the program. Games are officiated by WIAA Referees. Four separate teams allow each child to play at their own level. The Rebels provide all equipment except shoes. A practice jersey is also provided. Player transportation is provided to away games. The Rebels also provide busses to practices at Schowalter Park for a small fee due to softball league play at the park on practice days.



Sign-ups will be held at the Village Municipal Center, 639 E. Green Bay Ave., Saturdays, May 7th and May 14th from 10:00 a.m. until Noon. There is a \$200.00 mandatory fund raiser fee required for each participant, due at sign-up. A fee of \$275.00 will be charged for late sign-ups, after May 14th.
