

Village of Saukville Recycling Guidelines



Recycling collection is done on a bi-weekly basis and is provided to:

- Single Family residences
- Apartment buildings with four or less dwelling units
- Small businesses that generate no more than one 96-gallon refuse container per week

All recyclables must be placed into your recycle cart and placed at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your designated day for collection.

Place your cart at the end of your driveway or on the grass between the side walk and curb. The carts shall be 3 feet apart from each other and at least 3 feet away from any post, mailbox, street light, or other object. Carts shall face the road as indicated by the arrow; the cart-handles toward the house.

The Village is paying for a fully automated collection system, which means that the driver should not have to get out of the truck to complete the collection. There is a mechanical arm that reaches out from the side of the truck, grabs the cart, dumps it, and then returns the cart to the curb. This is why it is so important to have your carts out correctly.

Accepted Materials

- Glass - bottles and jars (all colors)
 - No windows, mirrors, Pyrex, or drinking glasses
- Aluminum, tin, and steel cans
 - No aluminum foil or food trays
- Plastic containers
 - All bottles and rigid containers labeled 1 thru 7
- Newspapers and cardboard
 - This includes newspapers, magazines, phone books, junk mail and envelopes
 - Corrugated cardboard or paperboard including cereal boxes, tissue boxes, egg cartons

Wisconsin Requires Recycling of Electronics (Effective September 1, 2010)

What must be recycled?

- Computers (desktop and laptop, including notebooks and tablets) & Monitors
- Computer accessories including keyboards, mice, hard drives, speakers, flash drives, modems
- Desktop printers (including those that scan, fax and/or copy)
- DVD players, VCRs, DVRs
- Televisions
- Fax machines
- Cell phones

Where can these items be recycled?

Best Buy: 1070 N. Port Washington Road, Grafton. Many electronics are free, however there is a \$10 fee for a computer monitor or television. Best Buy will in turn give you a \$10 gift card for the store.

Milwaukee PC: 10914 N. Port Washington Road, Mequon. Only allows drop off of desktop computers, printers, monitors, and laptops. There is no charge for this service.
